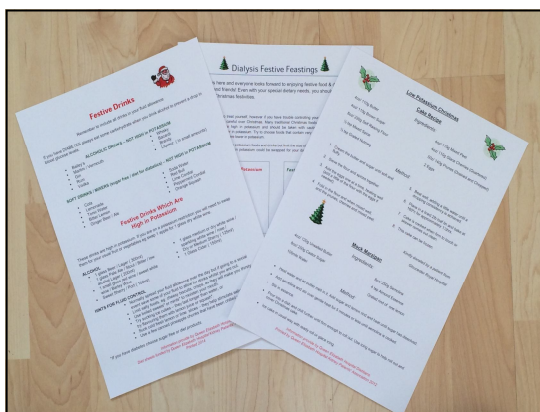
Equipment for the Hereford Dialysis Unit

The K.P.A. has purchased a special set of Body Composition Scales for use by the Dietitians and Consultants at the Hereford Dialysis Unit.

These will help the staff monitor the weight and condition of patients treated there.

The cost of these is £2150 and the money had been raised by patients and friends at Hereford for the K.P.A. with the request that some of the money should be used for the benefit of Herefordshire Patients.

The Consultant requested this equipment to help improve the treatment for patients.



The K.P.A. supports healthy eating

The Queen Elizabeth Hospital Kidney Patients' Association funded Healthy Eating Diet Sheets for the Renal Dietitians to give out to patients to help with choosing healthy options for Christmas and other festive occasions.

There are 2 sheets and 1 booklet.

Two New Dialysis Units in Smethwick

The dialysis centre will be located in Rabone Park, off Rabone Lane, Smethwick and is well positioned for travelling via public transport due to its proximity to Smethwick High Street. There are a number of bus routes (54, 61 and 854) that stop very close to the building and Smethwick Rolfe Street station is just a short walk away. The Midland Metro tram is also close by.

The new Smethwick Dialysis Centre unit, which will be run by Assure Dialysis Services, will consist of two 20-station dialysis units. Initially, the centre will open with two 16-stationed units, growing to 20 stations over the phased transition.

This includes eight isolation rooms for patients returning from holiday dialysis, research facilities and a home haemodialysis training area.

In addition the stylish new centre will have a large waiting area and reception as well as a number of meeting rooms, a 30-seater seminar room, offices, training rooms and staff facilities. Patients will also be able to take advantage of the latest dialysis equipment, individual TV units and Internet access. Ample free parking is also

available directly outside the building for patients.

Project manager Jane Roddick, who is overseeing the build of centre in the Smethwick said: "We are really looking forward to opening the new unit in Smethwick. The design will make the environment a restful one, with light

and space and good facilities for both patients and staff.

"A lot of consideration has been given to the location, and to factors such as heating and lighting, as well as the quality of the furnishings such as chairs – which we know has a big impact on comfort."

Over the coming weeks the team will be looking at which patients live close to Smethwick and contacting patients to discuss moving to the new unit. If you

About our fundraising

We have had a number of patients comment that they objected to the number of requests for money and repeatedly being asked to buy raffle tickets etc.. Patient Transport

Patient Transport for many renal patients has been difficult. The K.P.A. has been working with the providers and U.H.B. to solve many of the issues patients have. We are always in close contact with W.M.A.S. to try resolve issues and find solutions.

There is a new contract being formulated and our Chairman Nick Flint is part of negotiations with the C.C.G's to ensure that Renal Patients needs will be met in the future. It will be some time before this takes effect. If you have any comments or issues you would like raising please contact us.

Update on Research Project funded by the K.P.A.

Vascular access research update..

The vascular access research group at the QEHB continues to make great progress with the help of support from the local kidney patients.

The clinical trial being run at the QE is one of the only ones of its kind in the world. It is based on the application of a simple drug applied to the skin at the time of a fistula operation. This drug has been shown to make the blood vessels expand and this is thought to make more fistulas successful.

As with all trials the design is to establish whether this treatment is better or worse than other

treatments and it is important to do well designed trials to be able to advance with treatments. The trial should complete in summer 2015 and will be reported at international conferences later in the year. In addition this study has demonstrated that QEHB is one of the few centres in the world that can deliver this type of study and the input, cooperation and interest in these projects that kidney patients show is a key factor in being able to do this.

For this reason QEHB is a central clinical partner in the ReDVA project, a large international collaborative study

attempting to unravel all aspects of vascular access. This is linked to many of the societies and organisations in the world that research fistulas and vascular access which puts QEHB as leaders in an expanding key area of cutting edge research. We value the input of all patients and are keen to hear from kidney patients wishing to know more about this research or get involved in new projects, particularly about their experience with dialysis, surgery or radiology. RED Silicon Wrist Bands

The Q.E.H.K.P.A. has organised free **Red Silicon Wrist Bands** for Q.E. dialysis patients. These are available from your dialysis unit. If you prefer, you can order one direct from the K.P.A. but you will need to send a 73p Stamped self addressed envelope to Nick Flint at the address below and stating what you require.

They come in two types:-

FISTULA LEFT ARM Or FISTULA RIGHT ARM followed by:- +No BP Testing / Needles + Q.E.H.K.P.A. There are 3 sizes:- Left arm 190mm, 200mm, 210mm. Right arm sizes 200mm and 210mm

As a guide to help choose, if you cut out the strip and wrap it round your wrist you can pick the size that fits best. The bands do stretch so they don't have to be bigger to go over your hand.

These are FREE to Q.E. Patients. If renal patients from other hospitals wish to purchase these they will cost £2.00 each plus 73p postage.

We are able to do this due to the generosity of all those who support our fundraising.
