IMPORTANT CHANGES to Patient Transport

Patient transport is a very important part of a renal patient's life. Late pickups, long waits, not sure when the transport will arrive etc are only some of the issues Renal Patients have to put up with.

The Birmingham Cross City Commissioners are currently planning a new patient transport contract. This will have a major impact on your treatment if it does not meet your needs. I am currently involved with this project keeping Renal Patients' needs for a good transport service as a priority.

Although there are now NICE guidelines for renal patient transport, which if implemented would make a significant improvement for patients, at this time these recommendations are not being included.

The CCG's are saying that Renal Patients do not need any special requirements for Patient Transport.

The New Proposals are:-Inward Journey within 10 miles: up to 60 Minutes Arrive 45 minutes early Collected within 60 minutes after treatment

Return journey within 10 miles: up to 60 Minutes

Over the next few months there are public consultations. You will be receiving questionnaires and be asked for your comments. Please do not ignore these opportunities to voice your opinion. It is the one opportunity you have to get a transport service that meets your needs.

You can send me your comments or send them to the Commissioners with the questionnaires.

New Smethwick Dialysis Unit Opens

A new 40 station dialysis unit opened on the 3rd June in Smethwick. This replaces the unit at City Hospital and enables patients who are treated at other units around Birmingham to dialyse closer to home. The Q.E.H.K.P.A. provided a bite and a drink to celebrate the opening of the new unit to welcome the patients on their first visit.

The centre, run by Assure Dialysis Services, is a purpose-built dialysis centre with a range of facilities including isolation rooms, a home haemodialysis training suite and seminar rooms. Gabby Kelly is the unit manager and will be seeing that patients are made comfortable while they have the dialysis they need.
