The New Patient Transport Service started on the 1st May

West Midlands Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (WMAS) has been awarded the fiveyear contract to deliver the Non Emergency Patient Transport Service (NEPT)

The new contract offers a better quality of service for patients and W.M.A.S. have to deliver this. The main changes that patients will see are:-

- Patients will be asked to OPT IN to sign-up for real time information alerts to track the status of their NEPT journey. This will give patients a Text /email when the vehicle is 20 minutes away from collecting from home.
- 2. Gives patients the option to provide patient feedback after each journey via SMS text message or email.
- 3. Patients should arrive for treatment 30 minutes before their appointed time and be collected within 30 minutes after finishing treatment.
- 4. Patients should spend no more than 1 hour on a vehicle if they live within 15 miles of their dialysis unit.
- Access to a wide range of ambulance vehicles to meet the medical needs of patients, including high dependency and bariatric patients.
- 6. A new patient charter which will provide information on response times and what patients can expect

These are the main changes and improvements patients should now be aware of.

The CCG will be introducing eligibility criteria for transport. Anyone who needs transport because of a medical condition is entitled to it. This means if you are unable to use public transport or are unfit to drive due to your condition or the treatment you are receiving then you are entitled to transport. If patients have a financial problem and are on benefits then the cost of train, bus, taxi, or petrol can be claimed back from the Hospital Travel Scheme. Your unit will have details about how to claim this.

To help the K.P.A. monitor performance and how these changes are implemented we ask all the patients who use transport to inform us about how the service is working for them.

Please text, email or write to us. Our contact details are on the back page. The only way to make sure you get the service you need and deserve is to let us know.

Send details of how you get on with the service giving times, dates, and the journey destination.

Patient transport must improve so help us to help you.

Taking part in the service are Mr. Madjit Mukadam from the Q.E. heart/lung transplant unit who will be speaking, Nick Flint from the Q.E.H.K.P.A, and The Arrow Vale Choir and professional soprano Gemma Turner will also be taking part.
