Their holiday last year was in Torremolinos, Spain. A party of haemodialysis patients set out knowing that they had two members of staff with them to support them with any problems that might happen while having dialysis treatment out there.

The area was beautiful, as you can see from these pictures very relaxing and friendly. The hotel catered for everyone's needs with regards to food and drink which was available throughout the day. There was different entertainment every evening along with activities for all ages throughout the day. The dialysis centre was just a five minute taxi ride away from the hotel and had a doctor there every session. The staff were friendly and did speak basic English. There was a snack and drink provided by the dialysis centre whilst patients were having their treatment. The unit was clean and well maintained with wheel chair access for those less able to walk.

The group was mixed, with some of the party wishing to go off and do their own thing during the day, while others liked to stay by the large pool and soak up the sun.



Most of the party got together in the evening to watch the entertainment and talk about the events of the day.

The holiday is open to any dialysis patient from the Q.E. The costs and details of dates and where they will be going this year will be available soon, so ask for details from your unit. It is a good opportunity for patients to gain confidence in having a holiday. Two members of staff from the Q.E. go along with the group so that they can give support to you while away from home.
