Q.E.H.K.P.A. funded Research Nurse

Following on from the generous funding by the Q.E.H.K.P.A. for a Renal

Research nurse to undertake research in the University of Birmingham Centre for Patient Reported Outcomes. We have now appointed Nicola Anderson to this post. Nic embarked on a 2 year part time Masters Degree in October 2016. She will be researching using Patient Reported Outcome measures (PROMs) to promote quality of care and safety in the management of patients with end stage renal disease requiring treatment with haemodialysis.

She will be working with a patient advisory group to develop the PROMs, looking at which outcomes and measures would be acceptable to both patients and clinicians. The work will also look at the detail around best timing for monitoring PROMs and also the best way of using them – for example – do people prefer electronic ways of communicating, using the phone or sending in paper forms.

Nic is currently signed up to many academic courses in the University department so that her work will be fully informed. She is fortunate to be working with a great team who are already working with the Q.E. renal unit looking at PROMs and its uses in patients with chronic long team kidney disease.

Update on The New Patient Transport Service

West Midlands Ambulance Service NHS
Foundation Trust (WMAS) has been awarded a five-year
contract to deliver a new non-emergency patient transport
(NEPT) service for around 8,500 patients a week from 1
May 2017. NEPT services are for people that have a
medical need, and require specialist assistance to travel
to or from NHS services. The service plays a critical role
in patient care and the CCGs are investing in the new
service to ensure patients receive a high quality, safe and
timely service.

By investing in this new service the CCGs, working with WMAS, will deliver a range of improvements for patients:

- Central booking hub, providing travel advice for patients who apply but are not eligible for free transport
- Give patients the option to sign-up for real time information alerts to track the status of their NEPT journey request
- Give patients the option to provide patient feedback after each journey via SMS text message or email
- A new patient charter, which will provide information on response times and what patients can expect

- Access to a wide range of ambulance vehicles to meet the medical needs of patients, including high dependency and bariatric patients
- Specially trained staff to ensure patients receive the best possible care and are sympathetic to their needs
- WMAS has invested in a specially designed fleet of vehicles that include the latest technology to provide real time information and journey status to patients
- Brand new strategically placed operating sites that bring real benefits to staff and the communities that they serve
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The new patients charter will be published in May 2017 when the service is launched.

We look forward to a new service meeting our needs.

Research Project at Q.E.for Renal patients with multiple diseases. The 100,000 Genomes Project

Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham (QEHB) patients with a number of renal diseases may be eligible to take part in the pioneering 100,000 Genomes Project.

The ambitious NHS England initiative aims to improve understanding, diagnosis and treatment of rare diseases and cancers by collecting and decoding 100,000 human genomes – complete sets of people's genes – paving the way for personalised treatment.

Patients with certain cancers and those with an eligible rare disease plus their families are being recruited via 13 Genomic Medicine Centres covering the whole of England.


University Hospitals Birmingham U.H.B. NHS Foundation Trust, which runs QEHB, is leading the West Midlands Genomic Medicine centre (WMGMC) – a collaboration of 18 NHS Trusts delivering the project across the region. Renal conditions currently eligible for inclusion are:

- Renal cancer
- Proteinuric renal disease
- Familial haematuria
- Atypical haemolytic uraemic syndrome
- Cystic kidney disease
- Congenital Anomaly of the Kidneys and Urinary Tract (CAKUT)
- Renal tubular acidosis
- Renal tract calcification (or Nephrolithiasis or nephrocalcinosis)
- Extreme early-onset hypertension
- Unexplained kidney failure in young people
